



MDTS COMBATIVE CARBINE SKILLS SERIES (CCS)

Course Description/Objectives:

MDTS combative carbine skills series emphasizes three critical elements of defensive shooting: Mindset, Skill-at-Arms, and Tactics. This collection of material is based from a number of sources, including but not limited to: military special operations training, law enforcement firearms training, government and civilian special weapons and tactics (SWAT) training, defensive/practical shooting competition, and the experiences of those who have been unable to avoid, yet survived violent confrontations. Training is conducted through a progressive series of range briefings and demonstrations, dry-practice drills, firing drills, skill-building exercises, live-fire tactical scenarios, and force-on-force gunfight simulations. All students, from basic to advanced, can expect to learn the most current and effective shooting methods, strategies, and tactics for gunfight survival.

The MDTs carbine curriculum differs from other training providers in that we offer all of our Combative Carbine Skills Courses in 4 hr blocks of instruction. We understand that a citizen, law enforcement officer or military serviceman's time is important to them. Some people just do not or cannot take 8-16 hrs out of their schedules to attend a training course. This is the MDTs way of providing training courses in a convenient manner without reducing the quality or efficacy of instruction.

Courses:

CCS 1, 4 hrs

Combative Carbine Skills 1 is our entry level carbine course. In this 4 hr. module of instruction fundamental skill sets will be presented and then drilled dry fire and live fire. Course content will include but is not limited to history & zero, modifications & sling options, administrative gun-handling, carbine ready positions, fundamental marksmanship, combative marksmanship, shooting responses, combative gun-handling, bilateral weapon operation, after action assessments and more...

CCS 2, 4hrs

Combative Carbine Skills 2 picks up where CCS1 leaves off building upon fundamental skill sets while increasing tempo and aggressiveness. Previously learned skills are refined and intermediate to advanced gun-handling skills are introduced. Course content will include but is not limited to conventional combative shooting positions, vertical and lateral displacement, proactive & reactive movement, weapon transitions and more...

CCS 3, 4hrs

Combative Carbine Skills 3 tests and evaluation students to skills and introduces more advanced gun-handling skills and drills. Artificial stress and multi-skill set performance at increased tempos force students to perform better and learn more efficient ways to operate their carbine or fighting rifle. Course topics include but are not limited to close tactical shooting and carbine combatives, combat turns, unconventional combative shooting positions, fundamental use of cover & concealment/barricade tactics, and more...

CCS 4, 4hrs

Combative Carbine Skills 4 takes the home defender, Law Enforcement Officer or Military Servicemen to the next level ingraining previously learned skills and introducing essential concepts of movement off the line of force and to cover while engaging threats. Course content is heavily focused upon realistic movement under stress without a decrease in combative accuracy. This course will include but is not limited to movement to cover & concealment, shooting on the move, introduction to partner tactics, tactical communication, tactical Scenarios and more..

CCS 5, 4 hrs

Combative Carbine Skills 5 delves deeper into and refines under duress fundamental skill sets such as bilateral carbine operation, one hand only skills, single hand manipulations, wounded shooter drills, shooting on the move, carbine retention & combatives and much more...

CCS 6, 4 hrs

The combative shooters ability to operate individually is paramount but there may be times when protecting a secondary party or working with a friend or team member is necessary. CCS 6 introduces fundamental partner skills such as tactical communication, coordinated fire drills, team movement, target assault drills, tactical movement in structures and much more...

Carbine Low Light Combat, 4hrs

This course takes the skill sets learned and utilized in Combative Carbine Skills 1 and applies them in a low light environment. In this 4 hr. module of instruction students will learn to effectively control their environment and subject/target with light. Concepts of firing, manipulating and operating the carbine with and without light in a low/no light environment will be presented. Course content will include but is not limited to tool selection discussion, low light shooting techniques, low light shooting responses, utilizing optics in low light, use of ambient light sources, target identification and selection, movement & navigation in low/no light, structure searching, locating & identifying potential threats and more...

AK Operator Skills, 8 hrs

You just bought or built one, now it's time to learn how to use it. Nearly one hundred million AK 47/74 series rifles have been produced to date making the Avtomat Kalshnikova the most prolific small arm in the world. Because of its simple design, robustness and affordability many of America's enemies are utilizing this weapon system. Understanding this weapon and how it differs from America's gun of choice the M4/AR15 is the goal of this course. The design, history and operation of this weapon system will be explored. Course content will include but is not limited to AK modifications & accessories, fundamental marksmanship, zero, AK specific manipulations, movement, use of cover & concealment, fighting from unconventional positions, grounded engagements, an introduction to partner tactics and much more...

Generalized Equipment List:

Serviceable carbine, comfortable clothing or duty uniform, 300 rounds ammunition/course, minimum of 2 extra magazines, carry system- bag, load bearing vest or cargo pants, state CCW, pistol, sturdy belt & strong holster, eye & ear protection, weather appropriate clothing, hydration, Note- A handgun is not required to attend the CCS courses

Optional Equipment:

Weapon mounted illumination tool, knee & elbow protection, note taking materials, lunch for full day classes
